

1. Canada's Maple Leaf

The Toronto Maple Leafs won the Stanley Cup 13 times and are second behind Montreal who have won 24 times.

The Toronto Maple Leafs are the most valuable franchise in the NHL over the last 10 years.
Current est. value is \$1.3 billion.

The Toronto Maple Leafs lead the pack for the most players inducted into the hockey hall of fame at sixty.

The Toronto Maple Leafs haven't made the postseason since 2004. Ticket prices are the third highest in the NHL but the Leafs have 13 years of sell out games.





5. Polar Bears in Churchill





9. Maple Syrup





10. The Northern Lights




