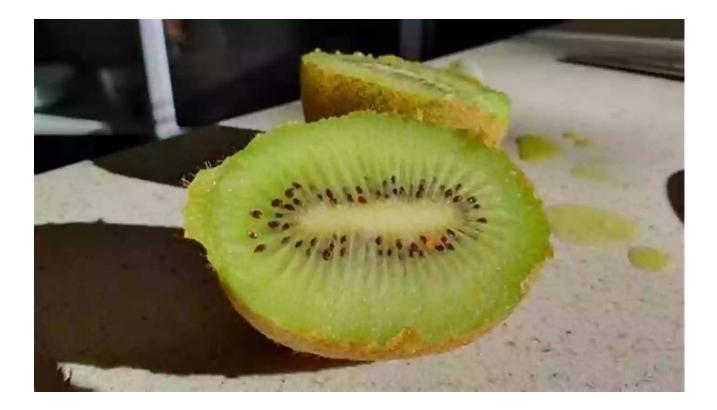
5. The Unforgettable Avocado

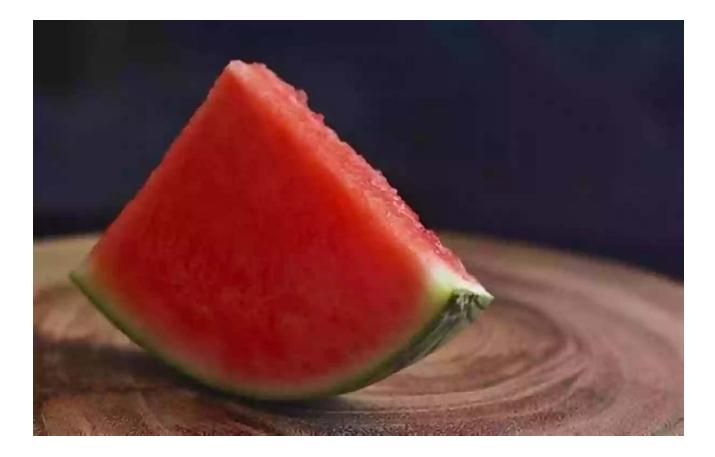
7. The Strange Durian

10. The Curious Iceberg Lettuce

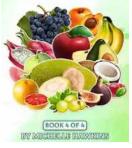

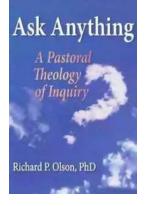
