

December 1941: The Day The Japanese Attacked Pearl Harbor

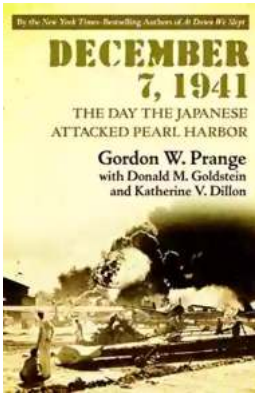

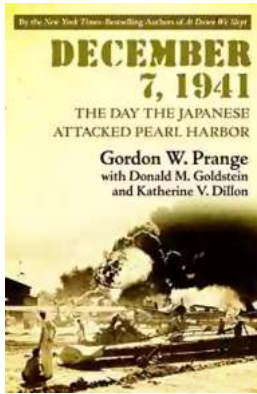
