

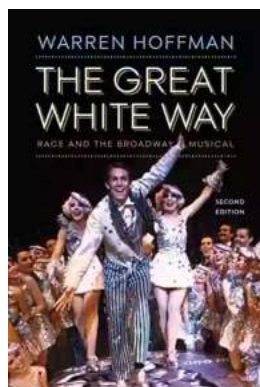

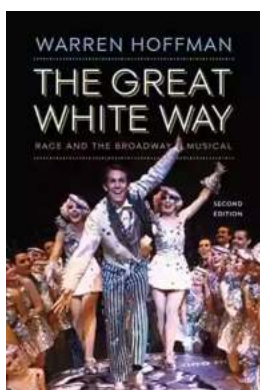

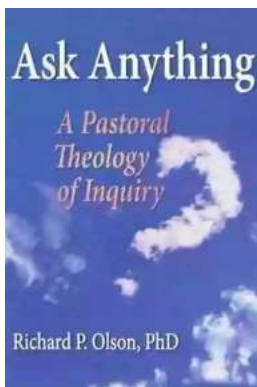

Musicals mirror their time periods and reflect the political and social issues of their day. He offers entirely new and surprising takes on shows from the American musical canon—*Show Boat* (1927), *Oklahoma!* (1943), *Annie Get Your Gun* (1946), *The Music Man* (1957), *West Side Story* (1957), *A Chorus Line* (1975), and *42nd Street* (1980), among others. In addition to a new chapter on *Hamilton* and *The Book of Mormon*, this revised edition brings *The Great White Way* fully into the twenty-first century with an examination of jukebox musicals and the role of off-Broadway and regional theaters in the development of the American musical.

New archival research on the creators who produced and wrote these shows, including Leonard Bernstein, Jerome Robbins, Stephen Sondheim, and Edward Kleban, will have theater fans and scholars rethinking forever how they view this popular American entertainment.
