



often differed from Mahatma Gandhi; his views regarding crucial matters were sometimes accepted many times by Gandhiji.

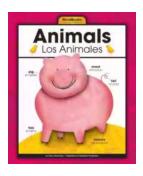
