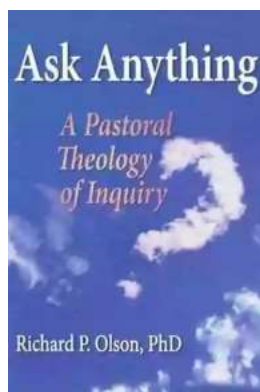

These two famous rulers along with Empress Dowager Cixi of the Qing Dynasty are known in the West as the three most powerful women in Chinese history. Cixi ruled until her death in 1908 C.E., just after placing her young nephew Puyi on the throne. The abdication of this boy Emperor in 1911 brought the long history of Imperial China to a close.
